FY 2015-2018 TIP - Missouri Local Program - Transportation Alternatives

County Executive Project Solicitation

Delbert Wittenauer East-West Gateway Council of Governments (EWG) announced a call for project Monroe County applications for federal funding through the Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) Members program on April 23, 2014. A Project Development Workshop took place on May 8, Mark Eckert Vice President, 2014. This workshop provided additional information on the project application Council of Mayors process and requirements to complete an application. A Project Review Workshop on President, Southwestern Illinois July 1, 2014 gave project sponsors an opportunity to present their project to a panel etropolitan & Regional Planning Commission representing MoDOT, EWG, Metro, and Trailnet. The panel offered feedback to the Ted Hoskins project sponsor on their proposed application. The project solicitation process Mike Livengood concluded on July 31, 2014 when project applications were due.

Council of Mayors Submitted Projects

^{Jack Minner} Missouri sponsors submitted 34 project applications, requesting approximately \$18.2 Roy Mosley million in federal funds for funding consideration through the TAP. Table A shows the Alvin L. Parks, Jr. breakdown of submitted projects by county.

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Available Funding

Original revenue projections for the TAP estimated that approximately \$8 million would be available for programming. In the past, Congress has approved short-term extensions for transportation funding in lieu of a multi-year law. The revenue projections were based on uncertainties related to Congress acting on an extension of the transportation law, Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21st Century (MAP-21) as it was slated to expire on September 30, 2014. Congress has extended MAP-21 through May 31, 2015.

Since the earlier revenue projections were made, we have been tracking Transportation Enhancement (TAP's precursor) spending and have determined that approximately \$8.6 million is available to program. Council staff has estimated that transportation funding will at least continue through extensions of the current transportation law, MAP-21.

Evaluation of Submitted Projects

Projects submitted for funding through the TAP are evaluated using the criteria based on the principles in the long range transportation plan, *RTP 2040*, which was adopted by the EWG Board of Directors in 2011. A team of three EWG staff evaluated and scored each of the projects. The team then met to discuss each project and their scores and to make adjustments where appropriate. The final score for each project is the average of the three scores of each member of the evaluation team for that project. Projects were ranked by total applicant score, and recommendations were made for inclusion in the FY 2015-2018 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) based on the amount of funds available for the year. Scoring criteria were included in the TAP project development workbook.

Attachment A shows the project cost effectiveness rankings for the TAP projects and EWG staff's recommendations for which projects should receive funding. Table B shows the breakdown of recommended projects by county.

CALL TO ORDER

The meeting was called to order by Rich Bradley, Chair.

<u>ITEMS</u>

Conformity Determination for Amendment to the FY 2015-2018 TIP and Related Amendments to RTP 2040 – Jason Lange presented an update on the status of the conformity determination revision. This is necessary when proposed amendments to the TIP and Long Range Plan are determined to be regionally significant. Typically, the conformity is updated during the annual TIP update in the summer. However, a midyear conformity is completed in January if needed. A couple of projects in the amendment required us to run the conformity determination. One project was a TIGER project awarded to Metro to build a new MetroLink Station, the other was a MoDOT project that was adding lanes in the westbound direction on MO D near Westport area. Other modifications include updates to RTP 2040 project descriptions including David Hoekel Pkwy and I-270 north. Descriptions of the project are in the memo.

The Conformity determination proceeded with the inclusion of these projects and passed all applicable budgets passed. Public comment is underway through January 22, 2015. A Public open house will be at EWG on January 13. The information presented at the open house meeting is on the website too. The Board will act on the revised conformity at its January meeting.

Supplemental solicitation for On-System Bridge Program (BRM) – Jason Lange presented an update on the supplemental BRM solicitation. Applications are due on January 15. Balance of BRM funds needs to be spent down by Sept. 30, 2017. Staff will bring listing of projects to the TPC at its February meeting. We will present TPC recommendations to Board at their February meeting. A question was asked when the earliest a sponsor could get funds obligated. The answer was after Board approval, it takes over a month to get federal approval, but probably mid-April. Mike Henderson of MoDOT indicated that the limitation is the Governor's office, some amendments take 30-60 days to get approval through them. Jason indicated that sponsors can make

project submittals to MoDOT – local programs for their review while we wait on final approval of the BRM projects.

FY 2016-2019 Local programs update – Jason Lange presented an update on the local program application (STP-S and CMAQ). EWG Kicked off applications and had workshops in December 2014. At the workshops, staff went over applications including changes to Person Miles Travel score. EWG is also asking for more supplemental information for pavement. Application deadline is Feb. 19. Goal is to bring submitted projects to March TPC meeting. Staff will score projects and present for TPC recommendations at the April 1 meeting. Meeting could be delayed if EWG gets more projects than anticipated.

The 16-19 TIP is following the same schedule as last year. If local project recommended for funding, it will be put in the draft TIP in May, open houses in June, and go for final approval in July.

Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) – 2014 funding round – Jason Lange presented an overview of the call for project applications through TAP. Applications went online April 23, 2014 and due July 31, 2014. EWG received 34 applications in MO and \$18.2 million federal in requests. These are summarized in memo. EWG had workshops in April and May. EWG estimated \$8 million available. Since then Congress extended MAP-21 and it was determined that \$8.6 million is available to program.

Submitted projects were evaluated based on criteria in the Long Range Plan. The Criteria was listed in project development workbook. Projects were scored based on 100 pts scale. Attachment A in memo shows projects listed in order by score. Staff recommended that 14 projects be advanced for Board approval.

Public comment on TPC recommended projects will begin today and go through January 22. Listing of projects will be at the open house next week. Sponsors are not required to attend.

Motion made and seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

Following approval, John Kohler asked about a future TAP solicitation. Jason replied it's uncertain while Congress continues short-term extensions of MAP-21.

Section 5310 – 2014 funding round - Rachael Pawlak presented on the recent Section 5310 paratransit program application round. This funding is available for traditional 5310 paratransit program and MAP-21 added New Freedom type projects to be eligible for programming as well under 5310. MAP-21 requires 55% be programmed for traditional paratransit projects, the remainder could be used for New Freedom (projects that go above and beyond ADA).

Project applications made for urbanized area (including Illinois). EWG conducted a solicitation for traditional and new freedom type projects in Missouri and only new freedom type projects in Illinois. Applications were released October 2014 and due December 12, 2014. IDOT will do a separate solicitation for traditional 5310 projects in that part of the urbanized area in February or March.

Selection of projects is based on FY 13/14 appropriations. St. Louis area received a little over \$3.8 million. 10% funding is taken off the top for administration costs so \$3.4 million available to program. EWG received 17 traditional applications requesting \$1.9 million and 8 New Freedom requesting \$2.3 million.

Projects evaluated based on the criteria in the Coordinated Plan which was approved by Board in July 2012. The submitted project list is included in the memo. Staff is recommending approval of 52 vehicles (traditional projects) totaling \$1.5 million and 7 New Freedom projects totaling \$1.5 million. The recommended projects will be submitted for public review and presented to Board at their January meeting.

Question was asked about one project not recommended. This project was outside of the limits of New Freedom program.

Motion – Ted Medler; 2nd – Jason Jonas – Motion passed unanimously

Reasonable Progress update – Sonya Pointer gave an update on the monthly Reasonable Progress report. This year 151 projects with \$109.6 million. \$23.4 million obligated so far this year, last year at this time was \$5.1 million. Most of the obligated are for PE. Several sponsors are going through RFQ process to select consultants. We expect another \$3 million in construction obligations in a week or so. Reminder letters will be sent out in the next week and project tracking will be sent out Friday. Projects are due to MoDOT by these deadlines: PE is April 30, ROW is June 30. Since Bill Hampton retired there has been staff changes in right of way so give them more time. Construction has July 15 deadline for PSE submittals. Also lots of turnover in the design side at MoDOT with retirements.
