#### CALL TO ORDER

The Executive Advisory Committee was called to order by Jonathan Zimmerman, Chair.

#### APPROVAL OF MINUTES OF JUNE 20, 2017 MEETING

Motion was made by Mr. Etling, seconded by Mr. Hicks, to approve the minutes of the June 20, 2017 meeting. Motion carried, all voting aye.

### **DISCUSSION ITEMS**

#### **Transportation Alternatives Program Project Applications**

Rachael Pawlak, EWGCOG, summarized the recent project solicitation conducted by EWGCOG for Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) projects. She advised that 15 Illinois TAP applications requesting \$3.8 million in federal funds and 33 Missouri TAP applications requesting \$18 million in federal funds were received, a summary of which was been included in the meeting materials. She advised that staff and Illinois and Missouri Transportation Planning Committees have since reviewed the funding requests and have made the following TAP recommendations: IL - 6 projects at a cost of \$1.46 million; and MO - 15 projects at a cost of \$9.1 million. She noted that the projects will undergo a public comment period prior to presentation to the Board of Directors for final approval and amendment into the FY 2018-2021 Transportation Improvement Program at its September 27, 2017 meeting.

#### **Illinois Great Streets Solicitation**

Paul Hubbman, EWGCOG, provided information on the upcoming Great Streets Project solicitation for Illinois projects. He reported that \$70,000 is available for consultant fees to assist EWGCOG with preparing a Strategic Planning Report. Project selection will take place in November 2017 after the call for projects and a workshop to provide assistance with applications. He noted that local match is not required for projects.

#### Scoring Criteria for Surface Transportation Block Grant Program

Rachael Pawlak, EWGCOG, summarized proposed changes to the methodology of scoring criteria used to guide decisions in selecting Surface Transportation Block Grant Program (STP-S) projects. She advised that changes in the current scoring criteria is crucial to developing a long range transportation plan and project evaluation structure that adheres to performance based planning as required by federal guidance. She noted that the Draft Scoring Criteria report will be presented to Transportation Planning Committee on September 6, 2017, and then to the Board of Directors at its September 27, 2017 meeting. She advised that a link contained in the meeting materials would provide additional information.

Additional discussion followed regarding whether new streamlining measures were taken into consideration during development of scoring criteria; to voice concerns relating to how projects would be weighted differently and unfavorably in the scoring process; how the proposed new criteria system favors larger, more expensive projects that will provide more outcome; and whether beta scoring was available for review.

#### **First Net**

Nick Gragnani, STARRS, provided information on the First Responder Network Authority ("FirstNet"), which Congress established to deliver a nationwide broadband network dedicated solely to enable public safety personnel to respond more quickly and effectively to incidents. FirstNet is led by a Board composed of leaders and executives from the public safety community; governmental entities; and technology, finance and wireless sectors. He described the requirements under the RFP that was issued through the competitive procurement process and advised that FirstNet selected AT&T to build and operate the network that has already been

funded for initial startup through the sale of communication airwaves. Mr. Gragnani advised that states do, however, have the option of opting out and creating their own plans through another vendor and reported that the State of Missouri has issued its own RFP to better analyze coverage and pricing options. He advised that RFPs received will be reviewed by the Missouri Office of Administration and the State Interoperable Communications Committee to make recommendations to the Governor, who will then make his recommendation by the end of. He noted that the State of Illinois was undergoing a similar process to consider whether to opt in or choose a different vendor.

### Auditors Report on Financial Statements for Calendar Year 2016

Royce Bauer, EWGCOG, summarized staff's recommendation for the Board of Directors to accept Kerber, Eck & Braeckel's independent audit report for the year ending December 31, 2016.

Motion approving the recommendation was made by Mr. Etling seconded by Mr. Courtway. Motion carried, all voting aye.

### **Consultant Selection for Kimmswick Great Streets Planning**

Paul Hubbman, EWGCOG, summarized staff's recommendation to authorize the Executive Director to: 1) to negotiate and execute a contract with Alta Planning and Design, or alternatively Farr Associates, to provide consulting services for the Northside-Southside Corridor Conceptual Design Study, in an amount not to exceed \$500,000; and 2) to enter into funding agreements with local project sponsors (City of Kimmswick, Jefferson County Port Authority, and Jefferson County) to provide the required 20% local match funding for the project.

Gary Elmestad voiced concerns about Alta Planning and Design's performance on previous projects for the City of St. Charles, MO.

Motion approving the recommendation was made by Mr. Courtway, seconded by Mr. Borders. Motion carried, all voting aye.

## Approval of the Metropolitan Transportation Planning Process Certification, the Final Air Quality Conformity Determination and Documentation for the FY 2018-2021 Transportation Improvement Program and related amendments to the Metropolitan Transportation Plan, *Connected2045*, and the Final FY 2018-2021 Transportation Improvement Program

Jason Lange, EWGCOG, summarized staff's recommendation for Board adoption of the Metropolitan Transportation Planning Process Certification, the Final Air Quality Conformity Determination and Documentation from the FY 2018-2021 Transportation Improvement Program and related amendments to the Metropolitan Transportation Plan, *Connected2045*, and the Final FY 2018-2021 Transportation Improvement Program.

Motion approving the recommendation was made by Mr. Gonzalez, seconded by Mr. Curran. Motion carried, all voting aye.

Where We Stand 7<sup>th</sup> Edition, Update 5: Innovation and Entrepreneurship

September 13, 2017

The seventh edition of *Where We Stand* (WWS), released in 2015, assesses the health and competitiveness of the St. Louis region by comparing St. Louis among the 50 most populous metropolitan areas in the United States. Periodically, East-West Gateway releases shorter reports known as *Where We Stand Updates* to analyze specific issues in greater depth and/or update the standing of St. Louis based on new data.

Staff will present on a new Where We Stand Update, covering Innovation and Entrepreneurship this month.

The U.S. economy has undergone substantial changes over the last several decades. As a result, regions throughout the country are facing pressure to become more innovative and economically productive. In St. Louis, efforts to attract and cultivate innovative workers and companies have gained both local and national attention. In light of these changes and the efforts taking place in the St. Louis region, this report examines multiple measures of innovation, including productivity and patenting, as well as measures of entrepreneurship, such as small businesses and startups. This update also looks at the readiness of the St. Louis workforce for the changing economy. Compared with the peer regions, this report finds that the St. Louis region generally ranks in the middle on most measures; however, there have been recent improvements in some areas, notably in venture capital investment and in educational attainment.

Authorization to Amend the Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP) and Enter into Agreement for Complex Coordinated Terrorist Attack (CCTA) Grant Funding

Earlier this year, staff applied to the Federal Emergency Management Agency for funding under a grant program to prepare communities for a complex terrorist attack. The application was one of 29 selected for funding. The St. Louis region was awarded \$1,474,716 with no matching funds required.

This funding will be utilized to identify capability gaps related to preparing for, preventing, and responding to a complex coordinated terrorist attack; develop and advance regional partnerships and whole community collaboration; train personnel and the whole community to implement the plans and processes and build needed capabilities; and conduct exercise(s) to test capabilities and identify opportunities for additional corrective action.

The associated Unified Planning Work Program element 2.90 is attached.

**Staff Recommendation:** Staff recommends that the Executive Director be authorized to accept the CCTA award from FEMA for the amount of \$1,474,716 and that the FY 2018 UPWP be amended to include element 2.90.

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## **Activities:**

- 1. Design and conduct a series of operational exercises that requires increasing levels of coordination among regional response agencies, requiring response agencies to establish a unified command and multiple area commands.
- 2. Develop a complex coordinated terrorist attack (CCTA) response plan that engages all appropriate regional partners, and includes matrices and field guides.
- 3. Incorporate CCTA plan into planned and scheduled training courses.
- 4. Conduct a series of operational exercises that test and validate CCTA plan.
- 5. Conduct scenario-based workshops to develop protocols by discipline.
- 6. Develop guides for use by front line personnel for integration of specialized teams.
- 7. Develop guides, protocols and forms for intelligence information sharing to and from the fusion center to responders, and identify communication mechanisms to share information.
- 8. Test newly developed guides, protocols and forms through training and exercises.

#### **Products/Outcomes:**

- A. The Complex Coordinated Terrorist Attack Response Plan, designed as a result of various operational exercises and coordination with regional response agencies. (June 2020)
- B. Guides, protocols and forms for front line personnel for integration of specialized teams. (June 2020)
- C. Guides, protocols and forms for information sharing. (June 2020)

Subject: Modification to the FY 2018-2021 Transportation Improvement Program, Metropolitan Transportation Plan – *Connected2045*, and the Related Air Quality Conformity Determination – Transportation Alternatives Program

September 12, 2017

East-West Gateway Council of Governments (EWG) is requesting to revise the FY 2018-2021 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP), *Connected2045*, and related Air Quality Conformity Determination to add 21 new projects under the Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP).

EWG announced a call for project applications for TAP funding on April 4, 2017 with applications due on June 19, 2017. TAP provides funding for on- and off-road pedestrian and bicycle facilities, community improvement activities, environmental mitigation activities, and safe routes to school projects. EWG received 15 TAP applications in Illinois requesting \$3.8 million in federal funds (\$1.4 million available) and 33 TAP applications in Missouri requesting \$18 million in federal funds (\$9.1 million available).

The projects were evaluated by EWG staff using criteria based on the principles in *Connected2045*. The Illinois and Missouri Transportation Planning Committee (TPC) made funding recommendations at its August 2, 2017 meeting. The Illinois TPC recommended six projects at a cost of \$1.46 million in TAP funds. The Missouri TPC recommended 15 projects at a cost of \$9.1 million in TAP funds. The recommended TAP projects are summarized in **Attachment A**.

The TAP recommended projects were posted to the EWG website for public comment from August 3 through September 5. At the end of the comment period, EWG received 28 comments. The comments are summarized in **Attachment B**.

## Staff recommendation: Staff recommends that the FY 2018-2021 TIP,

*Connected2045*, and related Air Quality Conformity Determination be revised to add 21 new projects as detailed in **Attachment A**. These projects are exempt with respect to air quality in accordance with federal regulations (40 CFR 93.126).
