DISCUSSION ITEMS

Local Strategic Highway Safety Plans

Anna Musial, EWGCOG, explained that the Strategic Highway Safety Plan (SHSP), a major component and requirement of the Highway Safety Improvement Program, is a data-driven,

multi-year comprehensive plan developed by the State Departments of Transportation in cooperation and collaboration with local, state, federal, and private sector safety stakeholders. The SHSP provides countermeasures for reducing fatal and serious injury crashes on all public roads by identifying key safety needs and guiding investment decisions. She summarized the development timeline of the SHSP in the Illinois and Missouri counties within the region, noting that staff will continue to work toward completing all SHSPs by October 2015.

The Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) is requesting to revise the FY 2016-2019 TIP, *Connected2045*, and related Air Quality Conformity Determination to add one new project and modify one project by splitting it into three.

IDOT is requesting to add one project funded through their Rural Sign Upgrade Program. This program is intended to upgrade existing signs in rural areas to current standards or install new warning or regulatory signs. Projects are selected through a statewide solicitation for projects. This project was originally programmed last April, but was unable to begin by the end of the fiscal year. IDOT is requesting it be added to the current TIP so that it can begin construction. The Missouri Department of Transportation (MoDOT), Metro, Jefferson County, and St. Louis County are requesting to revise the FY 2016-2019 TIP, *Connected2045*, and related Air Quality Conformity Determination to add three new projects, modify two projects, add six scoping projects, and modify one scoping project.

New Projects

Local projects

Jefferson County and St. Louis County are each requesting to add one bridge replacement project. Jefferson County will replace a bridge on Eime Road at a total cost of \$527,000. St. Louis County will replace a bridge on Tesshire Dr. at a total cost of \$1,750,000. These projects are funded through the Off-System Bridge Program (BRO). BRO funds are allocated to a county based on the square footage of locally maintained deficient bridges within the county.

Metro Project

Metro is requesting to add one new project. This project was originally planned to be finished prior to FY 2016 and was not included in the FY 2016-2019 TIP. However, due to delays it needs to be added to the current TIP. The project is for light rail vehicle lifting jacks and the total cost is \$106,754.

Subject: Functional Classification Update

Staff at East-West Gateway Council of Governments is recommending approval of an update to the functional classification system for the region. Functional classification is the process by which all roadways are grouped into classes according to the type of service they provide. The Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) requires the use of functional classification to determine eligibility for federal funding. There are three principal roadway classifications: arterial, collector, and local roads. To be eligible for federal funds, a roadway must be classified as a minor collector or higher in the urban area or a major collector or higher in the rural area.

In order to accurately reflect changes in land use and travel patterns, staff, along with MoDOT and IDOT, solicits revision applications from member agencies semi-annually and conducts a full system review every three to five years. County and municipal officials from Missouri and Illinois submitted applications requesting functional classification changes to East-West Gateway during the month of May 2015. Staff worked with IDOT, MoDOT, and local officials to prepare this recommended update.

The applications were reviewed in the context of FHWA guidelines including mobility, accessibility, and connectivity. Staff also visited sites to verify conditions. Requested changes are recommended where it was deemed that a road's current classification is no longer consistent with its function. In some cases, it was found that current conditions did not support a change in classification as requested.

There are 43 recommended changes. Six applications are not recommended, since they did not meet the criteria for a change in classification at this time.

Once approved, the update will be sent to MoDOT and IDOT headquarters for final review and subsequent submittal to FHWA for approval.

Staff Recommendation:

Staff recommends adoption of the functional classification update for the St. Louis region as summarized on the attachment(s).








Map 2 - City of Sunset Hills, Missouri














Map 5 - St Charles & St Peters, Missouri

Map 7 - City of St. Louis, Missouri










Map 8 - St Clair County, Illinois

Map 9 - Madison County, Illinois







The agency budget will be considered at the upcoming annual meeting by the membership of East-West Gateway, following a recommendation by the Board of Directors. Attached is the Council's proposed budget for the year beginning January 1, 2016. We are proposing a budget of \$9,374,510. Approximately twenty-five percent of this budget will pay for public safety planning, equipment, software and training that will be provided to our member local governments and area first responder entities. An additional twelve percent, for transportation, economic development, and environmental work, will be passed through to other public agencies and planning consultants. The Council's staff and operating costs is projected to be approximately \$5.6 million.

East-West Gateway's budget includes expenditures for work activities included in the FY 2016 Unified Planning Work Program, as well as those activities anticipated to be in the FY 2017 UPWP. We've estimated funding for the Highway Transportation Planning, Environmental, Bioterrorism Hospital Preparedness, and Urban Area Security Initiative programs. Match for the Highway Transportation Planning and Environmental initiatives in the amount of \$376,000 will be provided in the form of cash or in-kind contributions from state and local agencies.

The funds received from the transportation project assessment fee, and the per capita contribution by member counties will be primarily utilized as match for the federal transportation funds. The voluntary contribution by member counties will remain at 12.5 cents per capita. The contribution represents less than four (4.0) percent of the budgeted agency resources for 2016.

Salaries and benefits totaling approximately \$4,893,600 include funding for 59 full time employees (FTE). This represents the same staffing level as budgeted for 2015. The proposed budget also includes a cost of living adjustment (COLA) of 2% for all employees, a 1% raise based on merit, and a projected increase in health insurance of 11%. The COLA and merit raise, along with the associated incremental benefits, are projected to cost \$125,800. We estimate that the net impact to the surplus for 2016 is \$13,200 and the balance of \$112,600 would be provided from the federal, state and other grant funds.
