Subject: FY 2016-2019 TIP – Missouri Local Program – Transportation Alternatives

Project Solicitation

East-West Gateway Council of Governments (EWG) announced a call for project applications for federal funding through the Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) program on September 28, 2015. A Project Development Workshop took place on October 15. This workshop provided additional information on the project application process and requirements to complete an application. A Project Review Workshop on November 3 and November 15 gave project sponsors an opportunity to present their projects to a panel representing MoDOT, EWG, Metro, and Trailnet. The panel offered feedback to project sponsors on their proposed applications. The project solicitation process concluded on December 7, 2015 when project applications were due.

Submitted Projects

Missouri sponsors submitted 29 project applications, requesting approximately \$16.0 million in federal funds for funding consideration through the TAP. **Table A** shows the breakdown of submitted projects by county.

Available Funding

Original revenue projections for the TAP estimated that approximately \$7 million would be available for programming. In the past, Congress has approved short-term extensions for transportation funding in lieu of a multi-year law. The revenue projections were based on uncertainties related to Congress acting on an extension of the transportation law, Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21st Century (MAP-21) as it was slated to expire on October 29, 2015 when the initial project solicitation took place.

Since the earlier revenue projections were made, Congress has passed a new multi-year transportation law known as Fixing America's Surface Transportation Act (FAST). TAP was combined into what is now known as the Surface Transportation Block Grant Program. Within this program there is a setaside of funding dedicated to TAP projects. FAST ensures stability to transportation funding over the next five years. Based on estimated funding available over the first half of the new law there is approximately \$8.0 million is available to program at this time.

Evaluation of Submitted Projects

Projects submitted for funding through the TAP are evaluated using the criteria based on the principles in the long range transportation plan, *Connected2045*, which was adopted by the EWG Board of Directors in 2015. A team of five EWG staff evaluated and scored each of the projects. The team then met to discuss each project and their scores and to make adjustments where appropriate. The final score for each project is the average of the five scores of each member of the evaluation team for that project. Projects were ranked by total applicant score, and recommendations were made for inclusion in the FY 2016-2019 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) based on the amount of funds available. Scoring criteria were included in the TAP project development workbook.

Due to the limited amount of federal funding available, the TAP application workbook indicated that sponsors that requested in excess of \$1 million in federal funding for a project should indicate if the project could be broken down into constructible segments. The Great Rivers Greenway Grant's Trail project requested \$3 million in TAP funding, however, staff recommends that only \$2 million be programmed for this project. Also, to ensure equity amongst municipalities, a sponsor cannot receive more than two projects for this round of TAP.

Attachment A shows the project cost effectiveness rankings for the TAP projects and EWG staff's recommendations for which projects should receive funding. **Table B** shows the breakdown of recommended projects by county.
