- ❑ Notice the “Baseline” and “Current” years, they differ based on the source of the data.
- ❑ *PROSPEROUS*: Economic metrics are positive when reported in total, but don’t tell the story of specific industries such as health care and hospitality.
- ❑ *GREEN*: Air quality and greenhouse gas emissions are improving through vehicle efficiency and conversion to clean energy.
- ❑ *CONNECTED*: Transit hit hard by pandemic. Access and ridership declined.
