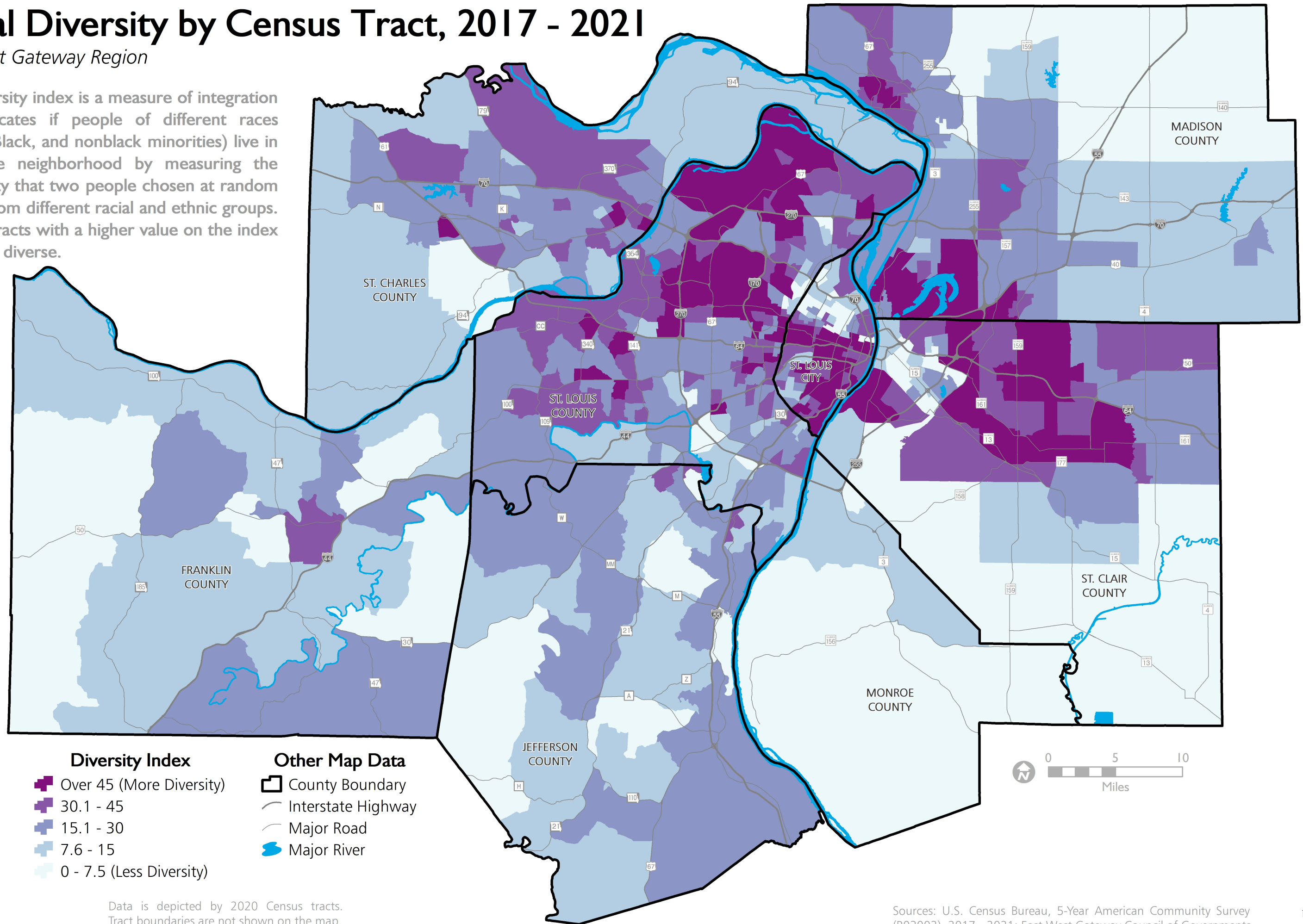


Racial Diversity by Census Tract, 2017 - 2021

East-West Gateway Region

The diversity index is a measure of integration that indicates if people of different races (White, Black, and nonblack minorities) live in the same neighborhood by measuring the probability that two people chosen at random will be from different racial and ethnic groups. Census tracts with a higher value on the index are more diverse.
