CALL TO ORDER

The Board of Directors meeting was called to order by Mr. Kern, Chair with roll call attendance; he introduced and welcomed all new members of the EWGCOG BOD.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES OF THE MAY 31, 2023 MEETING

Motion made to approve the minutes of the May 31, 2023 meetings was made by Mr. Elam, seconded by Mr. Grogan, all voting aye.

DISCUSSION ITEMS

Draft FY 2024-2027 Transportation Improvement Program and Regional Air Quality Conformity Determination

Jason Lange, EWGCOG, provided a brief update of the draft document and summarized the progress of Total Program including IDOT, MoDOT, and Transit programs noting that the Illinois Governor has not yet released the IDOT program; once released, the IDOT program will be added to the document. Mr. Lange also summarized Local Programs, Major Projects, Fiscal Constraint, and pointed out that the Air Quality Conformity Analysis was complete. He mentioned that the public comment period begins June 30th through August 2nd; information pertaining to Open Houses as well as other downloadable documentation and comments will be available on the Council's website. Final approval will be made at the August meetings.

Local Program Balance Update

Marcie Meystrik, EWGCOG, reported on efforts by MoDOT to change the unobligated balances of local funds (STP-S, CMAQ, etc.) policy from three years of funding to one year (essentially a "use it or lose it" requirement). She noted that, historically, program balances have not exceeded the three year limit but MoDOT has expressed concern. Ms. Meystrik pointed out that staff, along with MoDOT, sponsors, and other MPOs have been collaborating to reach an equitable solutions. She also mentioned that plans for lowering balances, advance and obligate projects, tracking inflation, and possible increases in federal funds are being considered as well. Mr. Wild pointed out that this is more so a Missouri State issue than Illinois, and even though the Council doesn't agree with the policy change, is hopeful for an open minded solution.

ACTION ITEMS

Auditor Services for Audit Years 2023 and 2024

Jim Wild, EWGCOG, noted that EWG is required to conduct an annual single audit. Mr. Wild pointed out that in February 2021, the Board authorized EWG to contract with Kerber, Eck, and Braekel (KEB) for audit services for each of the audit for the years 2020 through 2022, with an option to extend the contract for a 1-year term for each of the 2023 and 2024 audit years. KEB

has been selected as EWG's independent auditor since audit 2012 and has continued to provide excellent service. EWG is seeking to retain KEB for the 5-year service term that we originally procured in 2020/2021. Following the end of this term, EWG will again solicit proposals from audit firms for the next 5-year term.

Staff recommends board approval authorizing the Executive Director to negotiate and execute agreements as recommended.

Motion to recommend approval of staff's recommendation was made by Mr. Schwind seconded by Mr. Simmons. Motion carried, all voting aye.

Amendment to the FY 2024 Unified Planning Work Program

Aaron Young, EWGCOG, informed the committee that a new EPA-funded climate pollution reduction grant is available to EWG to produce a Climate Action Plan for the St. Louis Metropolitan Statistical Area aimed at reducing emissions of carbon dioxide, other greenhouse gases, as well as criteria air pollutants. The UPWP would need to be amended to include this new program. Mr. Young pointed out that this process will be completed in two phases noting that Phase One will not be competitive, but Phase Two would be. He also pointed out this would be a two-year process beginning with the Preliminary Climate Action Plan by March 2024 followed by the Comprehensive Climate Action Plan by August 2025 with a Status Report in August 2027. Mr. Wild noted that plans are underway to bring in an expert to discuss/address concerns for later in the year.

Staff recommends board approval to amend the UPWP to include the new work element and authorize the Executive Director to negotiate and executive all agreements towards this program.

Motion to recommend board approval of staff's recommendation was made by Mr. Laker seconded by Ms. Geisman. Motion carried, all voting aye with one nay.

Approval of the Final Air Quality Conformity Determination and Documentation and Adoption of the Long Range Transportation Plan Update, *Connected2050* and State of the System Technical Supplement

Saranya Konala, EWGCOG, provided the final long-range transportation plan, Connected2050, for board approval. She pointed out that the draft document was provided at the April meetings, public comment period has been conducted as well as various virtual and pop-up aspects held resulting in comments and changes made to the document. She discussed feedback summaries regarding demographics, gave examples of questions and the rating rationale of those questions, pointed out the emergence of key themes that resulted from those questions, noted that significant changes/updates have been made based on input received, as well as provided a detailed summary of the document.

Staff recommends board approval of the final document.

Motion to recommend board approval of staff's recommendation was made by Ms. Jones seconded by Mr. Simmons.

Mr. Ehlmann moved to amend page 11, under subtitle "Seamless, Efficient, and Reliable" to add "Even those in Jefferson City understand to grow the State's economy, it is important to improve

the inefficiency and capacity of freight corridors. The state legislators recently approved Governor Parson's plan to invest \$2.8 billion to improve I-70. Likewise, it is critical for the region to prioritize and invest in infrastructure needed provide a seamless, efficient, and reliable transportation system." Following discussion the amendment was withdrawn.

Motion made by Mr. Ehlmann to amend page 20, under subtitle "Unfortunate Disparities" line 2 after work "Languishing" by deleting "Neighborhoods that have fewer employers, quality schools, and recreation opportunities are facing increased crime and vacancy," seconded by Mr. Williams. Following discussion a roll call vote was held. Seven ayes, 11 nays; the motion failed.

Mr. Ehlmann moved to amend page 18, under subtitle, "Equity Spotlight Unemployment," paragraph 2, line 8, after the word "jobs" by deleting: "The St. Louis region has experienced this phenomenon. In 1969, 42 percent of all jobs in the EWG region were in the City of St. Louis. By 2020, the percentage had shrunk to 17 percent," and replacing with: "In 1969, there were .7352 jobs per person in the City of St. Louis. By 2020, that ratio had increased to .9179 jobs per person in the city. The ratio of jobs per person in the region has changed very little – increasing from .5808 in 1969 to .5873 in 2020." seconded by Mr. Williams. Following discussion a roll call vote resulted in six ayes, 12 nays; motion failed.

Motion made by Mr. Ehlmann to amend page 11, under subtitle "Well-maintained and Resilient," line 3 after the word "repair" by deleting: "The decades—long emphasis on system expansion has strained resources available for rehabilitation and repair," and inserting: "With driving by Missouri residents down five percent per capita between 2000 and 2012, vehicles becoming more fuel efficient, and no increase in the fuel user fee per gallon in 20 years, the purchasing power of MoDOT had decreased by more than fifty percent. MoDOT decided to meet the maintenance needs of the system before building new or improving existing roads in the system. While maintenance is all most rural counties needed, counties in the region that are growing in population or increasing the number of jobs need new and improved roads. Now that MoDOT will have increased funding, an increased emphasis needs to be put on transportation projects that will spur economic development." After discussion and staff noting that they had specified the timeline (1980's and 1990's) regarding the investment statement Mr. Ehlmann withdrew his amendment.

Motion made by Mr. Gannon to amend page 24, under subtitle, "An Ecological Approach to Transportation," by deleting the entire section and replacing it with: "Land use decisions have traditionally been the province of county and municipal governments. The job of EWGCG is come up with a plan that serves the people where local government has determined they can and where they want to live." second by Mr. Ehlmann. After discussion a roll call vote resulted in six ayes, 12 nays; motion failed.

A roll call vote was held on the original motion to recommend board approval of staff's recommendation. Motion carried, with 12 ayes and six nays.

Extension of September 30, 2023 Suspense Date for Locally Sponsored Projects

Jason Lange, EWGCOG, provided the committee with an overall background and eligibility process for allowing sponsors a one-time extension request. He noted that as of the June 1st deadline, staff received 36 eligible requests for schedule extensions beyond the September 30, 2023 suspense date. Mr. Lange pointed out that four of the 36 projects requesting extensions

were for a three-month extension, and the remaining 32 requests were for nine-month extensions. He noted that staff has reviewed the status of these four projects granting the requested extension per the board's policy, and is sure that they will make the September 30th deadline.

Staff recommends board approval of the 32 projects identified to be granted a nine-month extension to the September 30th suspense date.

Motion to recommend board approval of staff's recommendation was made by Ms. Jones seconded by Ms. Geisman. Motion carried, all voting aye.

Modifications to the FY 2023-2026 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP), Connected2045, and the Related Air Quality Conformity Determination – Requested by Illinois and Missouri Sponsors

Jason Lange, EWGCOG, provided the committee with requests from the Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) and the Missouri Department of Transportation (MoDOT) to amend the TIP by adding one new project, modifying one project, and scoping 13 projects. The project summary is as follows:

Kristen Capps-Jones, EWGCOG, presented to the committee staff's request authorizing expenditure of funds in support of regional security that will improve the region's disaster preparedness and response capabilities for a CCTA Intelligence Liaison Officer (ILO) Program within the St. Louis Regional Fusion Center, for a total amount not to exceed \$229,273 from the UASI grant program.

Staff recommends board approval authorizing expenditure of funds from the UASI grant in support of regional security that improve the region's disaster preparedness and response capabilities.

Motion to recommend board approval of staff's recommendation was made by Mr. Simmons, seconded by Mr. Elam. Motion carried, all voting aye

OTHER BUSINESS

Ms. Jones thanked everyone for their prayers and support during the recent downtown incident involving several youths. She noted that efforts are being made towards the creation of "safe places" for youth such as recreation centers and other spaces preferred by youths. She pointed out that youth come from all over the area in search of activities and is asking that everyone look for ways to engage youth in their areas.

Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP)

August 16, 2023

East-West Gateway Council of Governments (EWG) released a call for applications on April 21, 2023 for Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) projects. This funding round was for Missouri sponsors only. TAP provides funding for a variety of transportation projects such as pedestrian and bicycle facilities, safe routes to school projects, community improvements such as historic preservation and vegetation management, and environmental mitigation related to stormwater and habitat connectivity. The project applications were due on July 21, 2023.

East-West Gateway received 27 project applications requesting \$28.9 million federal funds. Based on initial estimates last April, approximately \$25 million in federal funding was available in the Missouri portion of the region, with a maximum of \$2.5 million per application.

East-West Gateway staff is currently evaluating the project applications. When staff completes the project evaluations, the scores will be presented to the Missouri Transportation Planning Committee (TPC) who will make funding recommendations at its October 4, 2023 meeting. The TPC recommendations will be presented to the EAC and the Board of Directors at their October meetings. EWG will then solicit public comment on the recommended projects, starting on October 27, 2023 and concluding on November 16, 2023. The recommended projects will be presented at the January 2024 meeting for final approval and inclusion in the TIP.

The table on the following page summarizes the number of TAP applications submitted and funds requested by county. The description, project limits, and costs for these projects are summarized in **Attachment A.**

Illinois Department of Transportation amendment to the FY 2024-2027 Transportation Improvement Program and related amendments to the Metropolitan Transportation Plan, Connected 2050

Board of Directors

This memo details proposed amendments by the Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) to the FY 2024-2027 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP). This is a discussion item in August. The projects will be presented to the Board of Directors for approval in October after the public comment period concludes.

IDOT Program Summary

The Governor of Illinois released the IDOT program on July 7, 2023 which was after the draft FY 2024-2027 TIP was released for public comment. Only IDOT projects with lettings scheduled through January 2024 (14 total projects) are included in the FY 2024-2027 TIP which is being presented for approval on August 30, 2023.

IDOT is requesting to amend the remainder of its program to the FY 2024-2027 TIP which includes 79 projects at a total cost of \$1.63 billion. This includes 25 new projects and 54 projects that are reprogrammed from the FY 2023-2026 TIP. The description, project limits, and costs for these projects by phase of work are summarized in Attachment A. The table below shows the breakdown of total funds by project type and geographic entity.

Auditors' Report on Financial Statements for Calendar Year 2022

August 16, 2023

Keber, Eck & Braeckel (KEB) has completed the Council's annual audit for calendar year 2022. The audit examined both the Council's financial statements and compliance with the requirements described in the OMB Compliance Supplement for each of the Council's major federal programs. The audit was conducted in accordance with generally accepted auditing standards, government auditing standards issued by the Comptroller General of the United States, and the audit requirements of Title 2 U.S. Code of Federal Regulations Part 200, Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards (Uniform Guidance).

We want to remind you of new language in the auditor's governance letter. Beginning with the 2021 audit year, new audit standards (Statement on Auditing Standards 134-140) went into effect that require additional communication with the Board of Directors about significant risks identified during planning for the audit engagement. The intent of these standards is to provide additional transparency in the audit process. To comply with these new standards, KEB's governance letter identifies these risks. The risks identified by KEB do not mean that they believe that EWG management has taken actions or has deficient processes that created these risks; these risks are presumed to be default significant risks in every audit engagement regardless of an entity's actual control environment. As auditors, KEB is required to design their audit procedures to respond to the identified risks. This is not a new process; this is a process KEB uses every year for EWG's audit. The only difference is that KEB is now required to communicate with the Board of Directors about the identified risks. Importantly, if KEB identified any issues with EWG's internal controls, it would communicate those to the Board of Directors in the Report on Internal Control.

KEB's audit did not identify any material weaknesses or significant deficiencies in the Council's internal control over financial reporting and did not note any noncompliance material to the financial statements as presented. KEB's audit also did not identify any

material weaknesses or significant deficiencies in the Council's internal control cover its major programs and did not identify any federal award findings or questioned costs. KEB issued an unmodified opinion with respect to both the Council's financial statements and the Council's compliance with its major programs. A summary of KEB's audit results can be found beginning on page 29 of the audit report (page 48 in the PDF version).

Metropolitan Transportation Planning Process Certification

Appendix A of the Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) document contains the Metropolitan Transportation Planning Process certification. This certifies that East-West Gateway Council of Governments (the Council) meets the requirements of 23 CFR §450.336 and must be signed by the Council, Missouri Department of Transportation (MoDOT), and Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT). It must also be approved by the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA) and Federal Transit Administration (FTA). The certification is part of the TIP document. The certification language may be found in **Attachment A** of this memo.

Air Quality Conformity Analysis

Since the St. Louis region is designated as a non-attainment area for air quality, the TIP must be analyzed to determine its conformity with air quality plans and objectives. Staff completed this analysis prior to the draft TIP being released for public comment in June. Subsequent TIP modifications were determined to have no impact on the conformity finding. The projects in the proposed transportation program meet the applicable air quality conformity requirements.

FY 2024-2027 Transportation Improvement Program

Each year the Board of Directors adopts a TIP that allocates federal funds to transportation projects. The program comprises the first four years of projects and strategies in the regional long-range transportation plan. Before a project is eligible to receive federal funds it must be included in the TIP.

The FY 2024-2027 TIP has been developed using priorities, procedures, and policies approved by the Board of Directors through the adoption of the long-range transportation plan. Staff has worked with project sponsors, funding agencies, and advisory committees to develop the recommended program of projects.

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Total Program Summary

The FY 2024-2027 TIP contains 825 new and previously programmed projects totaling nearly \$3.82 billion. The majority of these projects (684) are currently programmed in the FY 2023-2026 TIP and presented for reprogramming with some adjustments. All of the projects proposed by sponsors to retain their program status are recommended for reprogramming.

The FY 2024-2027 TIP differs from the draft TIP that was submitted for public comment. Fifty-one projects have been added and eleven projects were removed, which yields a net increase of 40 projects. A majority of the projects added to the TIP are carryover projects from the FY 2023-2026 TIP including local projects that received a one-time schedule extension in June. These changes are reflected in the table below by program and detailed in **Attachment B**.

IDOT Program Summary

IDOT's program contains 14 reprogrammed or rescheduled projects at a total cost of \$92.3 million. The 14 projects included in the FY 2024-2027 TIP were included in the FY 2023-2026 TIP and are scheduled for letting through January 2023 in FY 2024. The Governor of Illinois released the IDOT program on July 7, which was after the draft TIP was released. The remainder of the IDOT program will be amended to the FY 2024-2027 TIP in October following a public comment period.

MoDOT Program Summary

MoDOT's program contains 241 projects at a total cost of \$1.84 billion. This includes 208 reprogrammed or rescheduled projects and 33 new projects.

Fifty-six percent of MoDOT's program is for preserving the existing infrastructure and seven percent is for capacity adding projects. Twenty-two percent of the program is for operational and safety needs. Another 14 percent of MoDOT's total program is allocated for projects such as studies or payback projects, including GARVEE bonds for the

Mississippi River Bridge, Safe and Sound, and the I-64 reconstruction. The remainder (one percent) includes work specifically related to pedestrian improvements.

Transit Program Summary

In Missouri and Illinois, 182 transit projects (163 reprogrammed and 19 new) were submitted for programming. The total cost of the transit projects is \$1.03 billion.

Bi-State Development/Metro's program consists of 77 projects at a total cost of \$967.1 million, while the program submitted by the Madison County Transit District contains 34 projects at a total cost of \$52.4 million. Most of the funding in Metro's and Madison County Transit District's programs comes from FTA Section 5307 funds.

The other 71 projects in the transit program (\$10.2 million) consist of Section 5310 (Enhanced Mobility of Seniors and Individuals with Disabilities) projects.

Summary of Local Programs

The local Illinois program contains 137 projects (103 reprogrammed and 34 new) at a total cost of \$229 million. The 34 new projects have a total cost of \$63.9 million (\$44.1 million in federal funds).

The local Missouri program contains 251 projects at a total cost of \$627.7 million. Included are 196 reprogrammed projects and 55 new projects. The 55 new projects have a total cost of \$177 million (\$116.4 million in federal funds).

Financial Capacity

The TIP is required to be fiscally constrained, with reasonable assurance that funds will be available to implement the proposed projects in a given year. Staff has evaluated the federal funds programmed in the TIP with regard to amounts authorized in federal legislation and anticipated federal spending limitations. The proposed federal funding levels for the entire program do not exceed the funds anticipated to be available in the various program years.

The state DOTs, transit agencies, and local sponsors have incorporated inflation factors into the cost estimates for their projects that are expected to be implemented beyond the first year of this TIP. Further, each of the local implementing agencies has submitted written certification indicating that non-federal matching funds are available for their respective projects. In this way, there is some assurance that proposed projects represent true commitments on the part of local agencies rather than project "wish lists." Board of Directors August 23 2023 Page 4

Public Participation

The draft TIP and Air Quality Conformity Determination were circulated for public comment from June 30 through August 2. Information on the comment period was posted on the Council's website, in the Council's *Local Government Briefings* newsletter, on the Council's Facebook and Twitter page, and advertised in local newspapers. Council staff was available to answer questions about the documents. Comments could be made through the Council's webpage, email, or mail. Overall, 27 people attended the public open house meetings. A total of eight comments were received through the online comment form, open house public comment form, email, and mail. Seven comments were on the draft TIP and one comment was on the Air Quality Conformity Determination.

A summary of the public comments received is included in **Attachment C.** Also, staff has assembled a separate *Summary of Public Comments* document that contains all of the comments received during the public comment period. Staff does not recommend any changes to these documents based on these comments.

Appendix A

METROPOLITAN TRANSPORTATION PLANNING PROCESS CERTIFICATION

In accordance with 23 CFR § 450.336, the Illinois Department of Transportation, the Missouri Department of Transportation, and the East-West Gateway Council of Governments (EWGCOG), the Metropolitan Planning Organization for the St. Louis urbanized area, "certifies" that the transportation planning process is addressing the major issues in the metropolitan planning area and is being conducted in accordance with all applicable requirements of:

- 1. 23 U.S.C. § 134, 49 U.S.C. § 5303, and 23 CFR Part 450 Subpart C;
- 2. Sections 174 and 176(c) and (d) of the Clean Air Act, as amended (42 U.S.C. §§ 7504, 7506(c) and (d)) and 40 CFR Part 93;
- 3. Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, as amended (42 U.S.C. § 2000d *et seq.*) and 49 CFR Part 21;
- 4. 49 U.S.C. § 5332 prohibiting discrimination on the basis of race, color, religion, national origin, sex, disability, or age in employment or business opportunity;
- 5. Section 1101(b) of the Fixing America's Surface Transportation (FAST) Act (Pub. L. No. 114-357) and 49 CFR Part 26 regarding the involvement of disadvantaged business enterprises in U.S. DOT funded projects;
- 6. 23 CFR Part 230, regarding the implementation of an equal employment opportunity program on federal and federal-aid highway construction contracts;
- 7. The provisions of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (42 U.S.C. § 12101 *et seq.*) and 49 CFR Parts 27, 37, and 38;
- 8. The Older Americans Act, as amended (42 U.S.C. § 6101 *et seq.*) prohibiting discrimination on the basis of age in programs or activities receiving federal financial assistance;
- 9. Section 324 of the Title 23 U.S.C. regarding the prohibition of discrimination based on gender; and
- 10. Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (29 U.S.C. § 794 *et seq.*) and 49 CFR Part 27 regarding discrimination against individuals with disabilities.

EWGCOG is exempt from the requirements of 23 U.S.C § 134(d)(2) and 49 U.S.C. § 5303(d)(2) because: (1) EWGCOG operates pursuant to the Missouri State and Regional Planning and Community Development Act (Mo. Rev. Stat. Chapter 251) and the Missouri Nonprofit Corporation Act (Mo. Rev. Stat. Chapter 355), which were both in effect on or before December 18, 1991; (2) these Missouri laws have not been amended after December 18, 1991, as regards EWGCOG's structure or organization; and (3) EWGCOG has not been designated or re-designated after December 18, 1991.

St. Louis Regional Freightway - 2024 Multimodal Project List

August 16, 2023

The St. Louis Regional Freightway Development Committee has developed a Freight Development Project List for the St. Louis region. The Committee members consist of a broad cross-section of industry leaders representing manufacturing, logistics, industrial real estate, workforce development, economic development organizations, academia, all modes of transportation both the IL and MO Departments of Transportation and the East-West Gateway Council of Governments. Through their collaborative efforts, the committee members prepared a priority list of multimodal transportation projects that align economic development with the region's supply chain.

The projects included with the attached 2024 Freightway Multimodal Transportation Project list were developed through a request for projects throughout the St. Louis region from state and local agencies and the Freightway Development Committee members. Criteria used for the project selection included economic impact, multimodal impact, efficiency impact, and safety and security in travel. The draft list was finalized February 15, 2023 by the Freight Development Committee and approved by the Freight Council in March 2022. The draft list was release to the public, posted on the TheFreightway.com and was published in several media outlets during the May 2023 FreightWeek STL.

Projects included on the list are intended to help drive economic growth through freight infrastructure improvements and will help raise awareness and support for multimodal infrastructure funding. Additionally, the final list will be incorporated into a Needs Analysis Plan and Freight Development Plan being developed by the Freightway.

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2024 PRIORITY FREIGHT PROJECTS ST LOUIS REGIONAL FREIGHTWAY



The 2024 Priority Projects List was initially released in May 2023, but the July approval of the Missouri Department of Transportation's (DOT's) Statewide Transportation Improvement Program and the Illinois DOT's Multi-Year Improvement Program prompted us to revisit it. The updated versions revealed changes to the funding and status of many of our priority projects that needed to be reflected. Other summer announcements provided details on additional funding secured for other projects on our list and put a number on the plans for the new terminal at St. Louis Lambert International Airport, and this mid-year update allowed us to also capture those important changes.

The updated 2024 Priority Projects List includes 26 projects totaling \$7.2B (including \$2.8B for the new airport terminal). Almost \$2.7 billion of those projects are already funded and under construction or partially funded and expected to start construction or design within the next few years, underscoring the ongoing commitment to improving freight infrastructure in the bi-state region. That's up from \$2 billion a year ago, a reflection of the progress being made advancing major projects through the development pipeline.

One of the most significant advancements is the fall 2022 completion of the \$222 million replacement of the Merchants Bridge, a vital rail link connecting Missouri and Illinois near Downtown St. Louis. It had been the region's highest priority infrastructure project since 2016. "The Merchants Bridge is one of those few locations in the St. Louis area where rail can cross from one side of the Mississippi River to the other, so any delay in that vital link had a follow-on effect up and down the network," said Joe Torp, Industrial Development Manager for Norfolk Southern. "We are very excited about the

completion of the Merchants Bridge, especially from the operations side."

More than \$1 billion in funded projects on I-270, \$403 million in funded improvements to Interstate 70, \$233 million in improvements advancing on I-55 from Rte. Z to U.S. Rte. 67 (MO) and \$57.6 million committed for rehabilitation of the MacArthur Bridge represent other landmark investments in the region's freight network. Meanwhile other projects are supporting critical first mile/last mile connections that serve our region's thriving industrial parks.

Compiled annually by the Freightway's Freight Development Committee, the Priority Projects List is a valuable tool used to align and amplify advocacy for support and funding for critical infrastructure improvements.

The following fact sheets provide more details on all the projects and how they are supporting multimodal connectivity and adding capacity to our freight network, so we can continue providing global access to shippers and carriers.



Staff is requesting authorization to expend funds in support of regional security that will improve the region's disaster preparedness and response capabilities. Funding will come from the U.S. Department of Homeland Security's Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI) grant program. Attachment A summarizes the purchases, totaling \$477,000.00.

ST. LOUIS FUSION CENTER:

Policy, Procedure, and Audit Advisor– The Policy, Procedure, and Audit Advisor position is a new part-time position within the St. Louis Fusion Center that will ensure that statutory privacy and civil liberties policies are updated and adhered to, that personnel are trained on the policies, and ensure that all other policies and internal controls are consistent with the privacy and civil liberties policies. As this is a new position that was not previously sought, remaining funds from Cybersecurity positions within the Fusion Center that were not fully expended will be utilized to fund the Advisor position. Staff is requesting approval to enter into an agreement with St. Louis County, Missouri to provide funding from the UASI grant to support the Policy, Procedure and Audit Advisor position in the St. Louis Fusion Center for the period of October 1, 2023 – September 30, 2024. The total cost for the position will not exceed \$30,000 from the UASI grant program.

REGIONAL CYBERSECURITY INITIATIVE:

Recorded Future Renewal – Staff is seeking the 12-month renewal of four (4) software licenses for the Recorded Future cybersecurity intelligence software for use by the Regional Cybersecurity Coordinator and Analyst, as well as other investigators and analysts in support of the Regional Cybersecurity Initiative. The software provides cybersecurity related intelligence and analysis of a unique nature to include threat, brand, vulnerability and geopolitical intelligence. The total cost will not exceed \$112,500 from the UASI grant program.

DOMESTIC VIOLENT EXTREMISM:

CobWebs Renewal - Staff is seeking the renewal of the Cobwebs online threat identification, social media analyst, and alerting tool for use by the Regional Cybersecurity Coordinator and Analyst, as well as other investigators and analysts, in support of the Homeland Security Grant Program's Combating Domestic Violent Extremism priority area, which is a required priority area by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security / FEMA in the UASI grant. The Cobwebs platform allows the Fusion Center personnel to identify online threats and threat actors and contributes to the exchange of investigation information and capabilities with Fusion Center peers. Three software (3) licenses, in addition to dark web monitoring access, will be renewed for a 12-month period. The total cost will not exceed \$107,500 from the UASI grant.

REGIONAL RESPONSE TEAMS:

Rapid DNA is a technology that can quickly analyze DNA to verify family relationships (kinship) and identify victims of mass casualty events. Current Rapid DNA devices represent an important innovation that deliver a DNA profile in 1-2 hours. A Rapid DNA system will allow regional mass fatality teams to respond to a mass casualty event and provide expedited identification of victims. Staff is requesting the purchase of one (1) Rapid DNA System for St. Charles County, MO from ThermoFisher Scientific / Life Technologies in an amount not to exceed \$227,000 from the UASI grant program.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends that the Board approve the expenditure of funds as follows:

- allow the Executive Director to enter into a sub-award agreement with St. Louis County, MO to support the part-time Policy, Procedure and Audit Advisor for 12 months in an amount not to exceed \$30,000;
- for the renewal of four (4) software licenses from Carahsoft Technology Corp of Reston, VA for an amount not to exceed \$112,500;
- for the renewal of three (3) software licenses and dark web monitoring access from Cobwebs America, Inc. of New York, NY for an amount not to exceed \$107,500;
