CALL TO ORDER

The Board of Directors meeting was called to order by Mr. Kern, Chair with roll call attendance.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES OF THE AUGUST 30, 2023 MEETING

Motion made to approve the minutes of the August 30, 2023 meetings was made by Mr. Roach, seconded by Ms. Geisman, all voting aye.

DISCUSSION ITEMS

Report on Human Trafficking

Dedee Lhamon, Founder of The Covering House, gave a brief background of the organization she founded to provide services and care for exploited human trafficking victims. She mentioned that the organization has been in existence since 2009 providing care for kids aged 12-17 who have been victimized through exploitation and trafficking. She noted that St. Louis is ranked in the top 20 cities mostly due to having an international airport, interconnecting highways, significant drug issues, and high number of men's clubs. She briefly described "who" are normally seen at her organization noting that 10% of the victims have been "taken" while 90% know who their traffickers/exploiters are (i.e. drug addicted parents, relatives, guardians, etc.). Ms. Lhamon noted that the average age is 14 but can be as young as 6 years of age. She mentioned that her organization mostly provide hands-on learning and basic life skills, as well as community-based services including foster care for younger children and professional development with the goal of reimbursing a childhood to the children who have been psychologically threatened and are very trauma-driven. She provided information and materials from a six-year survivor from her organization who is now thriving on her own and operating a successful business.

Mr. Lhamon also noted that she is hoping to raise awareness of this ugly and difficult situation that's happening in our area and mentioned that St. Louis City has a dedicated department that investigates these instances through a trauma bonding program as well as customized training for utility companies, hotels, and other groups to aid them in looking for "red flags." She mentioned that she is available to anyone to share more information or answer questions. The Chair thanked her for sharing this information.

Task Force 46 Exercise

Samantha Lewis, EWGCOG, informed the committee of an upcoming Dense Urban Terrain (DUT) training event being planned in the St. Louis area for 2024. She explained that the mission of the CBRN National Response Framework is to provide lifesaving and logistics capabilities as well as command and control that would maintain public confidence while mitigating CBRN effects. She further noted that the DUT holds an annual training event in

select cities and St. Louis will be the sixth location since the exercise began. Ms. Lewis briefly discussed the types of activities and objectives to be held during the training event and noted that the St. Louis event will be similar to the recent Nashville training event. She mentioned that the event will be held in August 2024 and that groups from St. Louis went to observe those activities to prepare for the 2024 Summer/Fall St. Louis event. She lastly mentioned that a recent Tabletop Exercise was held and that plans are underway for a concepts and objectives meeting set for October as well as a DUT Exercise for some time in December. More information will be shared as it develops. A question was posed regarding the organization's involvement in responding to rail incidents similar to the recent Ohio rail incident. Mr. Wild noted that at the request of Mr. Kern and Ms. Jones, plans will soon be developing to address derailment training exercises for the area.

ACTION ITEMS

Agreement to Develop the Problem Analysis for the St. Louis Violence Reduction Strategy John Posey, EWGCOG, noted to the committee that EWG staff has been working towards developing a week long practicum to develop a Problem Analysis. He mentioned that the Problem Analysis will look for a variety of information (i.e., motivation, victims, suspects, gangs, etc.) and other contextual information. He pointed out that staff will need to work with a national network to aide in completing this analysis and have chosen National Network for Safe Communities (NNSC) at John Jay College to gather data for the development of the Problem Analysis for the Violence Reduction Strategy.

Staff recommends board approval to enter in agreement with the NNSC to develop the Problem Analysis.

Motion to recommend approval of staff's recommendation was made by Ms. Jones seconded by Mr. Page. Motion carried, all voting aye.

Modifications to the FY 2024-2027 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP), Connected 2050, and the Related Air Quality Conformity Determination – Requested by Illinois and Missouri Sponsors

Jason Lange, EWGCOG, provided the committee with requests from the Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) and the Missouri Department of Transportation (MoDOT) to amend the TIP by adding one new project, modify one project, and add one scoping project. The project summary is as follows:

Subject: Great Streets – Illinois Planning Panel

Since 2006 the Great Streets Initiative planning assistance program has supported 22 communities throughout the region, with two more efforts currently in progress. To expand the utility of the program to include small localized challenges and work with communities previously not competitive for the planning assistance, East West Gateway (EWG) will conduct a "Planning Panel" in the spring of 2024.

EWG will select, through a competitive application process, up to 4 projects. Once the projects are identified panelists will be selected, including four individual consultants (economic, transportation, natural systems, and land use/urban planning). Relevant agency representatives and EWG staff will complete the panel.

The centerpiece of the effort is a four day panel event, hosted by EWG. Prior to this event, the panelists will investigate existing conditions for each of the four projects. The event itself will include collaborative discussions to properly define the project problems and goals, then draft and refine tailored recommendations for developing, implementing, and sustaining solutions.

Project sponsors will receive a detailed memo, outlining these recommendations, including scope, recommended phasing, budget guidance, partnerships, framework for engagement, and potential funding sources. The open collaborative process should also raise awareness of planning resources, strengthen professional relationships, and make future similar issues easier to address.

Subject: Section 5310 Recommended Projects

Date: October 11, 2023

East-West Gateway Council of Governments (EWG) released a solicitation on April 21, 2023 for projects seeking Enhanced Mobility of Seniors and Individuals with Disabilities (Section 5310) program funding. The Section 5310 program provides funding to help improve the mobility of seniors and individuals with disabilities by removing barriers to transportation services and expanding the available transportation options. An informational workshop providing details on the project application process and program requirements took place virtually on April 27, 2023. Project applications were due on June 21, 2023.

At the conclusion of the solicitation period, EWG staff received nine (9) Traditional project applications, requesting sixteen (16) vehicles at a cost of approximately \$1.1 million in federal funds and six (6) New Freedom Type applications requesting approximately \$1.4 million in federal funds, for a total federal request of approximately \$2.5 million.

Approximately \$2.7 million is available for this solicitation in FY 2023 and remaining FY 2022 New Freedom funds. Section 5310 funds are apportioned to the St. Louis, MO-IL Urbanized Area (UZA). Traditional projects include the acquisition of accessible vehicles and related equipment. New Freedom Type projects include 1) public transportation projects that exceed the requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990 (ADA), 2) public transportation projects that improve access to fixed-route service, and 3) alternatives to public transportation. The Section 5310 program requires a 20 percent local match for capital and mobility management projects and a 50 percent local match for operating projects. Eligible sponsors include non-profit organizations, local public entities, and operators of public transportation services.

Section 5310 projects selected for funding must be included in a locally developed, coordinated public transit-human services transportation plan. EWG's Coordinated Human Services Transportation Plan (CHSTP) identifies the transportation needs of seniors and individuals with disabilities and provides strategies for meeting those needs. The CHSTP was updated and approved by the Board of Directors in May 2020 in accordance with the federal requirements.

At this month's meeting, the Transportation Planning Committee (TPC) recommended all fifteen (15) projects for the full amount of federal funds requested. The listing of recommended

Section 5310 projects are included in **Attachment A.** The total amount of federal funds requested was less than the amount available to program, leaving \$170,571 to be programmed during the next Section 5310 call for projects. The recommended projects will be open for public comment from October 27 to November 16, 2023. Following the public comment period, the recommended projects will be presented to the Board of Directors on January 31, 2024 for final approval and amendment into the FY 2024-2027 TIP.

Subject: Summary of Transportation Alternatives Program Project

Recommendations

Date: October 11, 2023

East-West Gateway Council of Governments (EWG) announced a call for project applications for federal funding for Missouri sponsors through the Transportation Alternatives Program (TAP) on April 21, 2023. TAP provides funding for on- and offroad pedestrian and bicycle facilities, community improvement and environmental mitigation activities, and safe routes to school projects. Project applications were due on July 21, 2023. EWG received 27 TAP applications requesting approximately \$28.9 million in federal funds.

Staff has completed the evaluation of TAP project applications and the Missouri Transportation Planning Committee (TPC) made funding recommendations at their October 2023 meeting. The Missouri TPC recommended 22 projects at a cost of \$25.3 million in TAP funds. **Table A** shows the breakdown of recommended projects by county. **Attachment A** details the TPC recommendations.

The recommended projects will be posted to the EWG website for public comment from October 27, 2023 to November 16, 2023. Following the public comment period, the recommended projects will be presented to the Board of Directors on January 31, 2024 for final approval and amendment into the FY 2024-2027 TIP.

Calendar Year 2024 Budget

Each year the Board of Directors reviews and approves East-West Gateway's calendar year budget and recommends the budget for consideration by the agency's full membership at its annual meeting in November.

The calendar year (CY) 2024 budget includes East-West Gateway's operating expenses as well as sub-awards and other pass-through expenses incurred to provide local agencies, jurisdictions, and organizations services, equipment, software, training, and funds for other project related expenses. The budget also identifies the federal, state, and local revenue that East-West Gateway anticipates receiving during the calendar year. The proposed CY 2024 budget is attached to this memo.

We are proposing a budget of \$13,005,622. Approximately 27 percent of this budget will pay for public safety planning, equipment, software and training that will be provided to our member local governments and area first responder entities. In addition, another 14 percent will provide consulting services for transportation and environmental work. The Council's staff and operating costs are projected to be approximately \$7.2 million.

East-West Gateway's budget includes expenditures for work activities included in the FY 2024 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP), as well as those activities anticipated to be in the FY 2025 UPWP. We've estimated funding for the transportation, environmental, healthcare preparedness, and homeland security programs along with the non-recurring projects that are anticipated during the year.

Funding in the amount of \$712,839, will be provided in the form of cash or inkind contributions from the states of Illinois and Missouri. In addition to the state funding, the funds received from the transportation project assessment fee and

the per capita contribution by member counties will also be utilized as match for the federal transportation and environmental grant awards. The voluntary contribution by member counties will remain at 12.5 cents per capita. The contribution represents approximately 2.5 percent of the budgeted agency resources for CY 2024.

Salaries and benefits totaling approximately \$6,164,639 includes funding for 58 full-time equivalent (FTE) employees. The proposed budget also includes a 4.0% pay plan adjustment to be effective January 1, 2024 and a projected increase in employee insurance of an average of 8.0%. The wage adjustment, along with the associated incremental benefit costs, are projected to be \$144,384. We estimate that East-West Gateway will absorb \$14,913 of the increase for 2024 and the remaining balance of \$129,471 will be provided from our federal, state, and local grant funds.

Personnel Plan Update

The Executive Director is required to review East-West Gateway's Personnel Plan at least every two years and make recommendations to the Board of Directors for changes. The Executive Director has reviewed the Personnel Plan, including the Pay Grade Plan. The Executive Director is recommending one change to the Personnel Plan, Attachment A – Pay Grade Plan, to reflect the 4% pay plan adjustment. The last change to the personnel plan was in 2022. The updated Pay Grade Plan, will be effective January 1, 2024 and is attached to this memo.

Staff Recommendation: Staff recommends that the Board of Directors: approve the proposed CY 2024 budget and recommend its adoption at East-West Gateway's Annual Meeting on November 15, 2023; and adopt the updated Pay Grade Plan.

Region

Date: October 11, 2023

The Council applied for and received a planning grant to develop a Comprehensive Safety Action Plan for the St. Louis region through the Safe Streets and Roads for All (SS4A) program as part of the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act. The Comprehensive Safety Action Plan will cover the entire eight-county region and once complete will enable any county or municipality in the region who chooses to adopt it to apply for SS4A implementation grants for projects that support the overall plan.

To solicit consulting services for the study, the Council released a Request for Proposals (RFP) on August 11, 2023 with a closing date of September 11, 2023. Three consulting teams responded to the RFP:

- CBB as the lead consultant with Civil Design, Inc. (CDI), Excel Business Concepts, and Equitable Cities
- Crawford, Murphy & Tilly (CMT) as the lead consultant with Lochmueller Group and Ten8 Group
- WSP USA, Inc. as the lead consultant with ICF and Vector Communications

A selection committee comprised of Council staff reviewed and scored the proposals. All three teams were interviewed on October 3rd. Subsequently, the selection committee recommended that the contract be awarded to the team led by CBB.

The Council will be the responsible contracting party.

Staff Recommendation: Staff recommends that the Executive Director be authorized to negotiate and enter into a contract with CBB. The contract amount will not exceed \$625,000. In the event that the Council cannot reach agreement with CBB, staff recommends the Executive Director be authorized to negotiate and enter into a contract with WSP USA, Inc.

The Governor of Illinois released the Illinois Department of Transportation (IDOT) program on July 7, 2023 which was after the draft FY 2024-2027 TIP was released for public comment. Only IDOT projects with lettings scheduled through January 2024 (14 total projects) were included in the FY 2024-2027 TIP that was approved on August 30,

IDOT is requesting to amend the remainder of its program to the FY 2024-2027 TIP which includes 80 projects at a total cost of \$1.63 billion.

There is a modification to the draft list of IDOT projects that was presented in August. There is one new project for resurfacing Frontage Rd in Livingston. This project is on the March bid opening and is included since federal funds will need to be authorized before the next Board of Directors meeting in January. The change is detailed below:

Air Quality Conformity

Public Participation

Public comment on the IDOT TIP amendment was from September 1, 2023 until October 4, 2023. Information on the comment period was posted in Local Government Briefings and in newspaper ads in the St. Louis Post-Dispatch, St. Louis American, and Belleville News Democrat. East-West Gateway staff also sent an email about the comment period to Illinois cities, villages, and counties that submitted an application for federal funding in 2023. Information regarding the TIP amendment and Air Quality Conformity Determination was posted to the Council's website throughout the comment period. There were no comments received on the IDOT amendment.

Staff Recommendation: Staff recommends that the FY 2024-2027 TIP, *Connected 2050*, and related Air Quality Conformity Determination be revised to include the IDOT amendment.

Missouri New Projects

Subject: Regional Security Expenditures

Date: October 11, 2023

Staff is requesting authorization to expend funds in support of regional security that will improve the region's disaster preparedness and response capabilities. Funding will come from the U.S. Department of Homeland Security's Urban Area Security Initiative (UASI) grant program. Attachment A summarizes the purchases, totaling \$570.500.

ST. LOUIS FUSION CENTER:

FirstNET Mini Compact Rapid Deployable (MiniCRD) Device – Staff is seeking approval to purchase a FirstNET MiniCRD device for the St. Louis Regional Fusion Center. FirstNET is a federal government initiative providing a dedicated mobile voice/data network for first responders such as law enforcement, fire, EMS, and emergency management. The MiniCRD provides connectivity to Wi-Fi and FirstNET phones and other devices during large-scale emergency response incidents, when communications are often disrupted. The MiniCRD will stabilize communications environments, improve operable and interoperable communications capabilities for first responders, and is capable of working with communications satellites, helping to ensure that even in the worst possible scenario (where all local communications assets are disrupted) communications can still occur with those beyond the scene. As the MiniCRD is a small, deployable, ruggedized device, it can also be deployed at planned events to increase and help ensure available bandwidth for public-safety FirstNET mobile phones and devices. The total cost of the MiniCRD from Rescue 42 CRD in collaboration with AT&T Mobility FirstNET will not exceed \$35,000 from the UASI grant program.

REGIONAL RESPONSE TEAMS:

Tactical Vests - The regional tactical response teams, including law enforcement and emergency medical services tactical rescue teams, require new personal protective tactical vests to safely respond to high-risk incidents involving weapons of mass destruction, complex coordinated terrorist attacks, active shooter and similar incidents. The regional tactical response teams, which include members from all

eight (8) counties in the region, have requested a total of 230 vests for an amount not to exceed \$535,500 from the UASI grant program.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends that the Board approve the expenditure of funds as follows:

- for the procurement of one (1) FirstNET Mini Compact Rapid Deployable (MiniCRD) Device from Rescue 42 of Chico, CA, in collaboration with AT&T Mobility FirstNET of Carol Stream, IL in an amount not to exceed \$35,000;
- for the procurement of 230 tactical vests for regional tactical response teams, which includes law enforcement and emergency medical services, from FirstSpear, LLC of Fenton, MO in an amount not to exceed \$535,500;

for a total amount not to exceed \$570,500 from the UASI grant program.
