



Roles and Responsibilities East-West Gateway

- Serves as regional clearinghouse for federal transportation funds
- Solicits for qualified project applications from LPAs
- Competitively scores applications and presents to Board for inclusion on the TIP
- Approves any change in scope, schedule, or funding
- Enforces Reasonable Progress Policy



Roles and Responsibilities MoDOT

- Provides guidance to LPAs concerning the necessary federal or state requirements
- Acts as liaison between LPAs and FHWA
- Coordinates necessary reviews and approvals
- Prepares and issues program agreements and any supplements
- Requests obligation of federal funds
- Processes reimbursement requests



Roles and Responsibilities Local Public Agency (LPA)

EPG 136.1.2:

- The necessary design, right of way acquisition, environmental, historical and archaeological clearances and approvals, construction and maintenance of improvements will be the responsibility of the LPA.
- The LPA must have a qualified person of responsible responsible charge.

Roles and Responsibilities Local Public Agency (LPA)

- Implements projects per scope and schedule in approved project application
- Follows all federal and state program requirements for design, right of way, and construction phases
- Requests change in scope, funding, or schedule from East-West Gateway
- Coordinates utility, environmental, railroad, and public involvement
- Submits timely reimbursement requests to MoDOT

Must be full time employee of the LPA

Need not be an engineer

Federal Aid Essential Videos

- FHWA implemented requirement in 2012
- Required certification for LPA
 Person of Responsible Charge and consultants
- Online video training
- 4 to 5 hours with a TEST
- Certification valid for 2 years

Project Support by MoDOT

- Project impacts on MoDOT Right of Way
- Requires MoDOT letter of support with application
- LPA contacts MoDOT Area Engineer for request
- MoDOT performs Risk Assessment/Role Assignment evaluation
- MoDOT includes any conditions on letter of support

Project Programming

- Project selected for federal funds
 - STP, CMAQ, TAP Letter of award from EWG
 - Cost Share, Governor's Cost Share Award notification from MoDOT
 - BUILD, RAISE, etc. Award notification from FHWA
- MoDOT assigns Federal ID Project number
- MoDOT prepares Program Agreement

Program Agreements

- Legal Contract
- Template for each funding type
 - Templates change periodically
- Enabling ordinance required for cities and counties
 - Identifies personnel authorized to sign agreement
- Effective December 1, 2020 ELECTRONIC ONLY



Engineering Selection Process EPG Section 136.4

- LPA In-House Engineering Services
 - Obtain MoDOT approval if seeking federal participation
- Consultant Engineering Services
 - Obtain MoDOT approval if seeking federal participation
 - Brooks Act (Federal Law) and Mini-Brooks Act (State Law) require Qualifications Based Selection (QBS)
 - QBS applies to ALL projects regardless of funding

Engineering Selection Process EPG Section 136.4

- Brooks Act (Federal Law)
 - Requires agencies to "promote open competition by advertising, ranking, selecting and negotiating contracts based on demonstrated competence and qualifications for the type of engineering and design services being procured, and at a fair and reasonable price"
 - This requirement applies to all projects that utilize Federal Aid funds for engineering
- Mini-Brooks Act (State Law)
 - Requires same as federal legislation
 - This requirement applies to ALL projects in Missouri regardless if federal funds are utilized or not

Engineering Selection Process Conflict of Interest

If Consultant prepared project application

- Fairly paid -> Eligible for consideration
- Not fairly paid -> Not eligible for consideration

If Consultant prepared or assisted with Request for Qualifications (RFQ)

 Regardless of payment -> Not eligible for consideration

If Consultant is under contract as city engineer

 Regardless of payment -> Not eligible for consideration

Step 1 – Scope of Services

- Determined by LPA based on project application
- Covers all necessary work items for the project
- Sample scope found in Fig. 136.4.7

RFQ Sample Scope of Services

Hazardous Waste Inspections

Inspect project prior to bid advertisement for asbestos and lead paint. The accompanying hazardous waste reports MUST be in the bid proposal. See <u>EPG 136.6.4.10</u> for further information on Hazardous Waste.

Sidewalks

The engineering responsibilities may include but are not limited to: The preparation of Conceptual plans, Preliminary plans, Contract plans, Right of Way

Step 2 – Creating the RFQ

- Recommended to use template, Fig. 136.4.7
- Any deviation requires pre-approval from MoDOT, even if prior projects used a variance

NOTE: Each RFQ must be submitted to MoDOT and reviewed for a DBE Goal prior to advertisement.

Disadvantaged Business Enterprise Program(DBE)

- Use MoDOT form
- Goal established by MoDOT External Civil Rights Division

Step 3 – Advertising the RFQ Solicitation

- Standard Solicitation Must be advertised at least 14 days
- On-Call Consultant Selection
 - Option for contracts under \$100,000 (PE and/or CE)
 - Pre-qualified consultants for on-call categories
 - Consider at least 3 consultants
 - Qualifications based selection
 - DBE requirements still apply

Step 4 – Response to the RFQ

Only pre-qualified consultants may be considered



Step 5 – Selection of Consultant

- LPA must rate at least 3 consultants
- Utilize scoring categories noted in RFQ
- Scoring sheets will be submitted to MoDOT
- Selection based on qualifications, not price

Step 6 – Contract Negotiations

- Consultant selected/notified -> Price negotiated
- Fixed fee is consultant profit, max is 15%
- Actual cost contract based on actual wages and overhead
- Subconsultants must be listed with supporting documentation
- No price shopping allowed

Step 7 – Consultant Contract Submittal

- Required to use template, Fig. 136.4.1
- Any deviation requires pre-approval from MoDOT
- No work shall begin until the PE funds have been obligated by FHWA, and MoDOT has given the LPA notice to proceed. Any costs incurred prior to PE obligation will not be reimbursable.

Engineering Services Contract Management

Supplemental Agreements

- Notify MoDOT of need
- MoDOT reviews for scope advertised in RFQ
- MoDOT issues verbal notice to proceed
- Reimbursement requests submitted after FHWA obligates additional funds, if applicable
- Original DBE goal applies to additional work

Engineering Services Contract Management

Invoicing and Reimbursement Requests

- LPA submits REGULARLY for reimbursement
- Actual costs incurred
- Use invoice form, Fig. 136.4.10
- Include DBE totals
 - ECR approves DBE as part of project close-out

Basic NEPA classifications

- Categorical Exclusion (CE) No significant environmental impacts, most common
- Environmental Assessment (EA) May or may not have significant impacts
- Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) Known to have significant impacts

- Programmatic CE (PCE)
 - By agreement MoDOT is allowed to automatically classify specific projects based on certain thresholds
- Non-Programmatic CE (CE2)
 - If thresholds are exceeded, MoDOT will advise LPA to complete CE2 form
 - CE2 must be approved by FHWA

Design EPG Section 136.7

- LPA must determine and document the appropriate design criteria required
- All work on National Highway System (NHS)
 must use AASHTO Standards
- All work on non-NHS routes must use approved state or local standards
- MoDOT's EPG complies with AASHTO Standards

- Prepare Preliminary Plans in accordance with:
 - Scope in TIP application
 - Applicable design guidelines
- Preliminary Plan submittal required for all projects
 - No MoDOT ROW impacts -> Review by MoDOT LPA staff
 - MoDOT ROW impacts -> Review extended to MoDOT Area Team staff



Then MoDOT issues approval of Preliminary Plans

All projects with federal funding must comply with the Uniform Relocation Assistance and Real Property Acquisition Policies Act of 1970 (Uniform Act)




- Right of Way process includes:
 - New permanent Right of Way
 - Easements Permanent or Temporary
 - Change in Property Access Driveway relocation, Number of driveway change, Change in driveway width, Access restrictions
 - Donation of property or easement for project duration

- Submit ROW plans even if no federal funds are used for ROW phase.
- Land Acquisition may begin <u>after</u>:
 - NEPA Classification is complete
 - MoDOT issues ROW approval
 - Federal Funds -> Acquisition date issued (A-Date)
 - No Federal Funds -> Notice to Proceed issued

Right of Way Clearance Certification

- If ROW acquisition was necessary for the project:
 - LPA submits Clearance Certification Statement
 - MoDOT reviews and concurs
- If realty rights were acquired 5+ years prior to federal fund request:
 - LPA submits "Five-Year Rule" statement

Railroads



- Railway company must be contacted if project impacts RR right of way
- LPA submits written approval of final plans from railway company
- If no RR impacts, LPA submits "No Railroad Impacts" statement
- RR Resources: EPG 136.9, EPG 643.4, Fed-Aid Essential Videos

Utility Coordination

LPA must inform utilities and identify conflicts

- Utility Scoping Checklist, Fig. 136.7.8
 - Preliminary Plans stage
 - No Preliminary Plans approval until utility companies are contacted
- Utility Status Letter, Fig. 136.9.6
 - Final Plans stage
 - Coordination must be cleared prior to construction obligation

Utility Coordination

If LPA is seeking Federal Participation:

- NEPA must be approved
- LPA to submit request to MoDOT
 - LPA-owned utility -> Submit estimate
 - Not LPA-owned utility -> Submit agreement from utility company
- No work may begin until approved by MoDOT
- Buy America policy applies

Proprietary Items

- Must list minimum of 3 competing products
- Must include statement "or equal" in specification
- Must include an "alternative product approval process" in specification
- If less than 3 products, LPA must submit Public Interest Finding (PIF) for MoDOT approval

- LPA must submit complete PSE package
- PSE must be approved by MoDOT
 - No MoDOT ROW impacts -> Review by MoDOT LPA staff
 - MoDOT ROW impacts -> Review extended to MoDOT Area Team staff

- -All projects in the St. Louis District must use standard boilerplate.
- -No modified local boilerplate versions except where allowed (highlighted) in the document.

Specifications EPG Section 136.9

- Bid Proposal must clearly indicate which standard specifications and standard plans apply
- All Job Special Provisions must be included
 - MoDOT ROW impacts -> Include JSP for Permitting Process
 - Permit for work on MoDOT ROW
 - Lane Closure Request Form

Engineer's Estimate EPG Section 136.7.4

- Shall include pay item quantities, unit prices, and extended totals
- Shall include pay item subtotals for categories:
 - Roadway
 - Bridge
 - Signing/Striping/Signals
 - Landscaping/Streetscaping
 Non-participating Work

- Bicycle/Pedestrian Facilities
- Utilities (if fed participating)
- Construction Engineering

Construction Engineering (CE)

- LPA must note intent of federal participation for CE with PSE submittal
- MoDOT must request obligation of CE with PSE
- MoDOT cannot add CE to a project after Construction Authorization has been approved by FHWA. If not added at Construction Authorization, CE must be funded by all local funds.
 - CE Consultant If not part of PE contract, start solicitation process early to avoid construction obligation and authorization delays.

Construction Authorization (Authority to Advertise for Bids)

- MoDOT will issue PSE approval pending:
 - DBE goal Issued by MoDOT ECR
 - Bid Opening Date Determined by LPA
 - Federal and State Wage Rates
 - Other Minor revisions, Pending agreements
- MoDOT will issue "Authority to Advertise" after:
 - FHWA authorizes Construction/CE funds
 - LPA submits FINAL As-Bid Documents Conditions resolved


Advertisement for Bid and Project Award, EPG Section 136.10

- LPA prepares and posts advertisement for bids
 - LPA must submit "Notice to Contractors" ad for Posting on MoDOT's website
 - LPA must advertise in local newspaper
 - Project must be advertised 21+ days
 - Longer advertisement period for complex projects, projects on MoDOT ROW, or if pre-bid conference will be held
 - LPA must ensure all contractor questions are answered
